


## Smithsonian National Museum of African American History and Culture Launches Web-Based Initiative to Celebrate its Inaugural Year (September 2016 – December 2017)




The Grand Opening of the National Museum of African American History and Culture (NMAAHC) on September 24, 2016 was a global moment in history. It showcased and honored

the work of institutions and individuals dedicated to preserving the many contributions of the African Diaspora to the American story.

In accordance with the inaugural year celebration, beginning September 2016 through December 2017, NMAAHC launched the *Lift Every Voice* (*LEV*) global initiative to highlight organizations co-celebrating the Grand Opening of the newest Smithsonian Museum.





The robust response to the LEV resulted in over 850 celebrations in 22 different international sites, across 20 countries, with many more expected throughout NMAAHC's inaugural year. The LEV is designed to showcase the depth and breadth of African American history and culture across the nation and around the world by encouraging partnering organizations to share

the great work being done in their communities, both nationally and internationally. NMAAHC institutional partners, such as museums, libraries, HBCU's, historic sites and cultural centers were encouraged to register their activities for inclusion in the web-based LEV directory.
